The Arc of Centre County PA, Inc. was founded as a grassroots organization in 1953 by a small group of parents determined to make a difference for individuals with I/DD.

As one of 700 state and local chapters, The Arc forms the largest civil rights organization in the United States devoted solely to the welfare of more than seven million people with I/DD and their families. The Arc works at the local, state and national levels to ensure the rights of people with I/DD are protected.

SERVICES (NES)

HOMF AND COMMUNITY SERVICES (HCS)

In-Home and Community Supports (HCS) meets an absolutely critical need for individuals and families in our community. Through the provision of this service individuals acquire, maintain, and/or improve upon the skills necessary to live in the community, to live more

independently, or to be more productive and participatory in community life. HCS Supports include communication, health maintenance, money management, relationship development, meal preparation and more!

COMMUNITY PARTICIPATION

SUPPORTS (CPS)

Community Participation Supports (CPS) serves as an alternative day program providing a 100% community based programming option. CPS focuses on community inclusion and interest exploration, while building on the potential for competitive integrated employment.

RESIDENTIAL **SERVICES**

Residential Services provide twenty-four hour supports in a licensed community home encompassing all aspect of daily life. Our Direct Support Professionals (DSP) and LPNs provide services in the areas of health maintenance, activities of daily living, behavioral support, socialization, community integration, financial management and recreation. Our community homes allow those supported to reside in community/ inclusive settings with specialized (person-centered) programming designed to meet their unique needs.



The Arc accepts referrals for these services from Centre County Mental Health/Intellectual Disabilities/Early Intervention-Drug and Alcohol Program Office.

BEHAVIOR SUPPORT **SERVICES (BSS)**

Behavior Support Services offered by The Arc include ongoing assessment and development of positive approaches to address challenging behavior and support the person to live and work in their community. Person-centered services encompass the development and maintenance of a Behavior Support Plan and its restrictive components if applicable, monitoring of progress within the plan, as well as skill building and training for the person, their support team, and their family.
